The term “Internet of Things” is appearing everywhere. It is used to describe how devices such as home air conditioning units, security systems and refrigerators communicate to their owners over the internet. It is used to describe tracking of vehicles, products and people via the internet. It is used to describe how corporations apply smart meters, instruments and sensors to measure and bill activity via the internet.

But what if these “Things” are not devices that can communicate over the open internet? What happens if they are large proprietary databases sitting behind a corporate firewall recording data from hundreds of thousands of sensors?
